

#### **Chancel Choir sings at Carnegie Hall**



Twenty-one members of the RHUMC Chancel Choir travelled to New York over the Memorial Day Holiday weekend to join with approximately 200 other singers from around the country to perform the New York premiere of John Rutter's new masterwork Canticles of Creation. The performance was presented in the world renowned Carnegie Hall with the composer himself conducting. The weekend included rehearsals on Saturday, Sunday and Monday, but allowed sufficient free time for the performers to take in various forms of New York entertainment - Broadway Shows, visits to the 9/11 Memorial, a New York Yankee game, and a nighttime cruise of the New York Harbor with spectacular views of the Statue of Liberty. The participants reported Mr. Rutter to be a charming but demanding master with indefatigable energy. It was a tremendous, lifetime, bucket list experience for all.
